Threatened Attack of Iloilo by Rebels Failed to Come Off-Movement of Koppe's Expedition.

Manila, May 20. - Major-General Otis has declined to recognize the rebels manders to refrain temporarily from aggressive action. Thus he is in a position to resume hostilities at any time. This will defeat any subterfuges to gain time which would not be the case if the general agreed to an armistice.
