Manila, May 23.-Rostario, a Filipino congressman, wealthy resident of Manila and formerly Aguinaldo's commissarygeneral, accompanied by an insurgent captain, called upon General Otis today and announced that "we desire to surrender our persons and property into the hands of the Americans."

The surrender was arranged by Chaplain Pierce, of the Fourteenth regiment, who knew Rostaria before the war. According to a story told by Rostario, General Luna is absolute dictator and Aguinaldo fears him. Every Filipino leader, it is added, suspects others of treachery. The recent meeting of the Filipino congress was to secure a new cabinet and the question of peace was not formally considered, as the members feared Luna's displeasure.
