Prof. Von Stengel has put the question in a nutshell. The trouble with arbitration is the coming of a time when nations will not arbitrate; when both sides are sullen and determined to put the issue to the test of the sword.

Even the benign plan of the czar, when reduced to its final analysis, contemplates resort to armed force. Arbitration is to be compulsory. That is to say, if one of the powers should refuse to yield to the decree of the international board of arbitration, the other members of the league would employ their armies and navies to force unwilling compliance.

Suppose, for example, Great Brit ain should lose in the great court of arbitration, and its government should be directed to perform a task repugnant to the heart of the British nation. Its statesmen and its press and people might sincerely believe that compliance with the decree would mean loss of national prestige, and sacrifice of vast commercial interests. It might be the case that the decree indirectly would menace also the commercial interests of the United States. Russia, France, Germany, Italy and Austria would then FRENCH & CO. set about the task of enforcing with armies and navies the decree of the arbitrators. It is not improbable that America would spring to the assistance of England, and that one or more of the minor powers would be.






