ADMIRAL DEWEY'S OPINION.

"I have the greatest enthusiasm will never part with the Philippines, I am sure, and in future years the idea that anybody should have sericuriosities of history."

This is the opinion of a patriotic citizen, expressed at short range, says the Spokesman-Review. It is spoken on the authority of long and close study, and will carry weight against the utterances of the arti-expansionists, who have been speaking at random, with imperfect knowledge of conditions in the islands, and fanciful notions concerning the character of the Filipinos.

Admiral Dewey has read, of course, the history of his country, and recalls that every movement made in the past century to carry the flag west of the Mississippi river has been resisted by well-meaning but shortsighted politicians. They opposed Jefferson's acquisition of Lousiana. They were against the annexation of Texas. They ridiculed the movement to bring in the Pacific Northwest. They did not want California; and Seward's purchase of Alaska was characterized as an act of supreme folly. Thirty years ago the nation would not have cared a copper if Seward's deal for that territory had gone by the board. Today we are wrangling with Canada over a narrow strip representing an almost infinitesimal part of the area of Alaska. Why this remarkable change in sentiment? Because the great mind of the nation realizes that every mile of American territory is needed for the fullest development of American resources.




