The principal city on the island, Zoambanga, has been bombarded and burned. The same dispatch reports trouble in Sulu.

The Americans have blockaded the port. A British steamer was denied admission and was escorted seaward by the United States gunboat Castine.

The insurgents who return are dealing vengeance upon those of their countrymen who have shown any friendship toward the Americans during the 'latter's occupation of the territory. The friendlies declare that unoffending people are being murdered daily, and that their houses are being burned and their property confiscated. Plenty of sympathizers with the insurrection remained during the American's stay, and they have been reporting these instances of friendliness toward our troops. The refugees and the inhabitants were badly oppressed by the native soldiers before American occupation, but their condition is worse now. Doubtless there is much truth in the reports, though stories from Filipino sources are always magnified.


