We therefore find that sugar refining under these conditions is receiving a protection of not 316, but 50 per cent advalorem, based on the cost of refining sugar. The protection granted the sugar-producers who make the article of sugar itself, is 50 per cent on the cost of raw sugar today, or identical with the protection granted the sugar-refining companies."

Mr. Oxnard declares that American sugar-producers would suffer and the development of the beet-sugar industry be retarded by the admission of raw sugar free of duty. He adds:

"There is no trust among the sugarproducers of this country and there never can be, for the simple reason that the beet-sugar industry can be started in almost any part of the Union."
