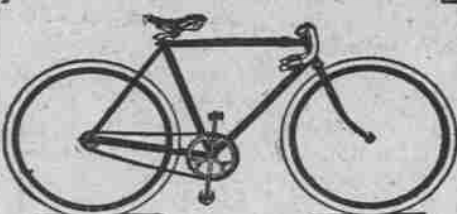
Notice.—Timber Culture.

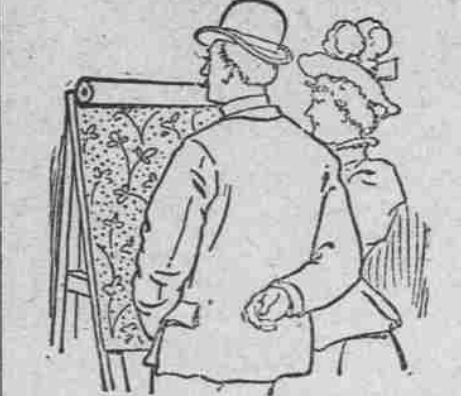
