According to the New York Journal of Commerce, about \$115,000,-000 of American securities have been thrown on the American market by Europe since the beginning of this year. This circumstance and the falling off in the favorable trade balance accounts for the gold exportation from the United States which has recently taken place. It is a little odd that Europe should drop so many American stocks at this time, but it probably means that the investors on the other side of the water think the present range of speculative prices can not be maintained. This is a delusion, of course. However, the return of these stocks reduces the debt of America to Europe to this extent, and adds this much to the holdings of American investors. On the whole, America and not Europe has been benefited by this transfer of property.




