TRUSTS EVERYWHERE.

Those who, like Mr. Havemeyer, assert that the tariff is responsible for trusts seem to forget the existence of like combinations in the countries where there is no tariff protection. A staff correspondent of the Philadelphia Press furnishes some information in regard to trusts in England and on the continent which shows that monopolistic combinations flourish there as well as in this country.

The correspondent says that trusts exist in nearly every country in Europe, and are quite common in England. There are over 200 in Germany, as enumerated in the newspapers of that country, and a large number in France. There are more in England than the public is aware of. These British trusts are organized on practically the same basis as the combinations in this country, and their methods of business are similar. They have the same general purpose that American trusts have, like means, even employing coercion.

A quotation is given from a Birmingham paper in which it is

in addition to the syndicates and trusts and combinations in England,

same remarks are applicable as regards institutions of learning in our own country. 




