### BOYCOTT AS A WEAPON.

Cleveland strikers and their sympathizers are encouraged by the apparent success of the boycott in operation against the Big Consolidated company and its patrons, but they have not explained how they are to maintain this style of warfare, says the Spokesman-Review. Nor have they any hope that it will force the Big Consolidated corporation to terms.

As an act of retaliation the Cleveland boycott may be justified. Since the Big Consolidated company refuses to employ men at their terms, one can see the justice in refusing aid and comfort to patrons of the Big Consolidated, and the method of showing disapproval might have some effect were it general enough. It is impossible, however, in a city the size of Cleveland to prevent the purchase of food if one has the money. Probably many of those who are boycotted are able to leave Cleveland and go elsewhere for a time, if need be. And the boycott of such a general character cannot last long enough to do serious harm. For a little while it causes inconvenience, then the men who engineer it grow weary, the "spotters" cease to spot and the result is loss of business to the small tradesmen and no benefit to the strikers and their sympathizers.

Boycotts confined to a single article and a single manufacturer have many times accomplished their object, but only because it gave competitors an advantage. In Cleveland there is no competitor to the Big Consolidated street car system worthy of the name, and the patrons of the road must look to it for transportation until some other means of quick travel comes along. If it were possible for the strikers to establish a line of automobiles and parallel the car lines, then a boycott might have some effect.

Grievances of labor will be adjusted only when the laborer learns to send the proper men to legislatures, or when he elects men to office who will enforce the laws enacted in his behalf. Violence cannot win. In the history of the strikes of Europe and America no victory has ever been gained by blowing up mills and few results have been lasting which were obtained by using the club of a general boycott.

Millionaire James Doyle, of Colorado, who thought his wealth would save him when he refused to obey an order of the court, is weary of his quarters in jail. His imprisonment for contempt is now sought to be nullified by appeal to the United States circuit court. It will be bad for justice if the appeal is granted,

because lower courts will be made more powerless to act in civil judgments.

When one country invents a machine to throw 113 pounds of explosive gelatine through armor without exploding and has further means of exploding the charge inside a vessel or fort it may be directed against, it is high time the peace conference sent the delegates of other countries home to invent some means of fighting back.

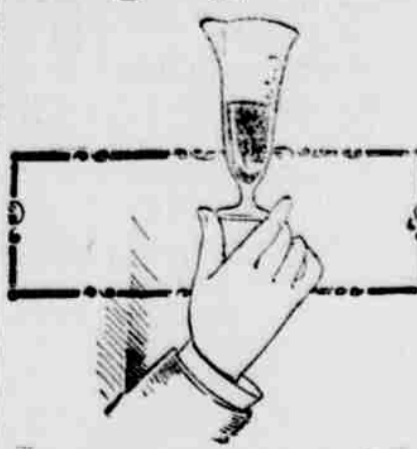

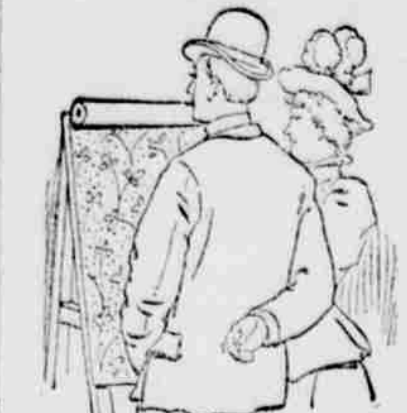
