The conventions exempting private property at sea from seizure, prohibiting the use of bullets that expand or explode in the human body, turowing of explosives from balloons and the use of asphyxiating projectiles, were not signed by all the powers. The United States signed only the declarations against the use of asphyxiating gases and the throwing of explosives from balloons, and the arbitration clause with reservations; but the final acceptance of these by this country will depend upon the ratification by the senate, as none of the conventions are binding upon any country until ratified by its treaty-making power. The delegates of our own country refused to condemn the dum-dum bullet, and the representatives of Germsny, England, Austria, China, Italy, Japan and several minor powers refused to condemn the dropping of explosives from balloons or the use of asphyxiating gases.

The delegates from the United States would not agree to prohibit the use of the dum-dum bullet because they said they were instructed not to assent to anything that would trammel the development of American inventive genius. 


