NOTICE.

Notice is hereby given that the city council of Dalles City has determined to establish a sewer system for the center of said city, lying below the bluff and east of Lincoln street, and has further determined that the cost of such sewer system shall be assessed against the property benefited thereby.

Said sewer system is to be of terra cotta pipe and the extent and location thereof to be as follows:

The main line of said sewer system shall extend from the low water mark of the mouth of Mill creek at said low water strikes said river; thence along the east bank of said Mill creek (50 feet to a stake 3-15-100 feet north of the Oregon Railroad & Navigation Company's railroad) thence at a right deflection of 10 degrees and 10 minutes from the course just pursued 131 feet to a stake 3-15-100 feet north of the west line of Union street; thence at a left deflection from the course just described, 76 degrees and 12 minutes, 125 feet to a stake 3-15-100 feet west of the west line of Union street; thence crossing Union street to the center of the alley between Second and Main streets and thence along the east line of Union street in a straight line on the same course across Laughlin street, to a point on the east line of Second street, 135 feet north of the center line of said street; thence continuing in a straight line on the same course, across block 8, Laughlin's addition to Dalles City, 300 feet, to Jefferson street, on a line 125 feet west of the center line of Second street; thence continuing on said straight line, in the same course, 10 feet into Jefferson street to a point 10 feet east of the west line of Jefferson street; thence at a right deflection from the line last described, 33 degrees and 23 minutes, 81-5-100 feet, to a stake 2 feet west of the east line of Jefferson street; thence at a right deflection from the line last described, 23 degrees and 23 minutes, 116-17-100 feet, to a stake; thence at a right deflection from the line last described, 27 degrees and 20 minutes, 114-10 feet to a stake 17-82-100 feet from the southeast corner of the lawn fence west of the O. R. & N. Co.'s depot; thence at a left deflection from said line 11 degrees and 14 minutes, 40 feet to a point on the west line of Monroe street 130 feet north of Second street and 57-100 feet north of the north-east corner of Moody's wooden warehouse 12-5 feet north of the center of said street; thence at a right deflection from the line last described, 11-3-100 feet, to a stake in Taylor street, 89-6-10 feet north of the center of the alley between Second and Union streets 20 feet east of the west line of the West warehouse.

A branch of said sewer system shall connect with the main line in Union street, 29 feet from the west line of said street, at a point 128 feet north of Second street, and thence along said Union street 20 feet east of the west line thereof, to a point 20 feet south of the north line of Tenth street.

Another branch line of said sewer system shall connect the center of the alley between Second and Third streets, at a point 40 feet west of the east line of Lincoln street, and run thence along the center of said alley to a point 10 feet east of the center of said alley, connecting with the branch of said sewer system running up Union street herebefore described, from the east and west, by convenient curves of about a 20-foot radius.

Also a branch of said sewer system commencing in the center of the alley between Second and Third streets, on the east line of Washington street, and running thence easterly along the center of said alley, to a point where the center of said alley intersects with the present sewer of Max Vogt & Co., where it crosses said alley. Thence northerly and easterly along the center of said alley, to a point located, to the point where said sewer intersects the main line of the sewer herebefore described, at a point where the main line of said sewer crosses Federal street, between Second and Third streets.

Also a branch line of said sewer system, commencing at a point in the center of said alley between Second and Third streets, 10 feet east of Federal street, and running thence along the center of said alley, to a point where the main line of said sewer crosses Federal street, between Second and Third streets; and thence continuing with the Laughlin street sewer by a left curve of about a 20-foot radius, in said Laughlin street.

Also a branch line of said sewer system, commencing at a point on the east line of Third street, running thence westerly, parallel to the south line of Third street, and 30 feet from said south line, to a point 40 feet east of the east line of Madison street; thence curving to the right with a curve of about a 20-foot radius, to a point in said Madison street 20 feet from the north-east corner of Third street and 50 feet from the west line of said Madison street; thence northerly along said Madison street on a line parallel with the west line of said street, to a point 20 feet from the west end of said street, and 20 feet south of the center line of the alley between Second and Third streets; thence deflecting to the left by a curve of about a 20-foot radius, to a point where the west line of said street intersects the center line of said alley between Second and Third streets; thence in a westerly direction along the center line of said alley to a point 20 feet west of the east line of Laughlin street; thence deflecting to the right by a curve of about a 20-foot radius, to connect with the branch of said sewer system running up Laughlin street, in said Laughlin street.

Also a branch line of said sewer system, commencing at a point in the center of the alley between Second and Third streets, 20 feet east of the east line of Monroe street, running thence in a westerly direction, parallel to the east line of said street, to a point 40 feet west of the east line of Monroe street, thence deflecting to the right by a curve of about a 20-foot radius, to a point in a westerly direction parallel with the west line of Monroe street, to a point 20 feet from the west end of said street, and 20 feet south of the center line of the alley between Second and Third streets; thence deflecting to the left by a curve of about a 20-foot radius, to connect with the branch of said sewer system running up Laughlin street, in said Laughlin street.

Also a branch line of said sewer system, commencing at a point in the center of the alley between Second and Third streets, 20 feet east of the east line of Monroe street, running thence in a westerly direction, parallel to the east line of said street, to a point 40 feet west of the east line of Monroe street, thence deflecting to the right by a curve of about a 20-foot radius, to a point in a westerly direction parallel with the west line of Monroe street, to a point 20 feet from the west end of said street, and 20 feet south of the center line of the alley between Second and Third streets; thence deflecting to the left by a curve of about a 20-foot radius, to connect with the branch of said sewer system running up Laughlin street, in said Laughlin street.

Parties desiring to go to Heppner should take No. 4, leaving The Dalles at 5:30 p. m., making direct connections at Heppner junction. Returning making direct connection at Heppner junction with No. 1, arriving at The Dalles at 5:15 p. m.

No. 22, through freight, east bound, does not carry passengers; arrives 2:50 a. m., departs 3:50 a. m.

No. 21, local freight, carries passengers, east bound; arrives 4:30 p. m., departs 5:10 p. m.

No. 21, west bound through freight, does not carry passengers; arrives 8:15 p. m., departs 9:20 p. m.

No. 22, west bound local freight, carries passengers; arrives 5:10 p. m., departs 6:20 a. m.
