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NOTICE.
Notice is hereby given that the city council of The Dalles, Oregon, has determined to establish a sewer system for all that portion of said city lying below the bluff and east of Lincoln street, and has further determined that the cost of such sewer system shall be assessed against the property benefited thereby.
Said sewer system is to be of terra cotta pipe and the extent and location thereof to be as follows:
The main line of said sewer system shall extend from the low water line of the Columbia river, where the east margin of the mouth of Mill creek at said low water strikes said river; thence along the east bank of said Mill creek 650 feet to take under the north trestle of the Oregon Railroad & Navigation Company's railroad, thence at a right deflection of 10 degrees and 10 minutes from the course last pursued 151-10 feet to a stake 1-15-100 feet north of the northwest corner of the stone wall bounding the E. M. Wilson property; thence at a left deflection of 10 degrees and 10 minutes from the course last pursued 125 feet to a point on the west line of Union street, 125 feet north of second street; thence crossing Union street to the center of the alley between second and third streets, thence along the center of said alley from Union to Laughlin street; thence continuing in a straight line on the same course across Laughlin street, to a point on the east line of said street, 125 feet north of second street; thence continuing in a straight line on the same course across block 8, Laughlin's addition, on the west line of Union street, 125 feet north of second street; thence continuing on said straight line, in the same course, 10 feet east of Jefferson street, to a point 10 feet east of the west line of Jefferson street and 125 feet north of second street; thence at a left deflection from the line last described, 35 degrees and 25 minutes from the east line of Jefferson street; thence at a right deflection from the line last described 23 degrees and 15 minutes, 116-17 feet, thence at a right deflection from the line last described 27 degrees and 20 minutes 110-100 feet to a stake 17-82 100 feet from the southeast corner of the lawn fence west of the R. & N. Co. yard; thence at a right deflection from said line 11 degrees and 41 minutes, 45-9-10 feet to a point on the west line of Monroe street 131 feet north of second street; thence at a right deflection from the north east corner of Monroe street 70 feet east of Monroe street; thence at a right deflection from the last line 7-2, 206-26-100 feet, to a stake 100 feet east of the west line of second street and 46-75-100 feet west of the west end of the Wasco warehouse.
A branch of said sewer system shall connect with the main line in Union street, 24 feet from the east line of said street, at a point 125 feet north of second street, and shall run along said Union street 20 feet east of the west line thereof, to a point 20 feet south of the north line of second street.
Another branch line of said sewer system shall commence in the center of the alley between second and third streets, at a point 40 feet west of the east line of Lincoln street, and thence along the center of said alley to a point 20 feet east of the east line of Court street, connecting with the branch of said sewer system running up Union street heretofore described, from the east and west, by convenient curves of about a twenty-foot radius.
Also a branch of said sewer system commencing in the center of the alley between second and third streets, on the east line of Washington street, and running easterly along the center of said alley, to a point where the center of said alley intersects with the present sewer of Max Vegt & Co., where it crosses said alley, thence northerly and easterly along the line of said sewer as it is now located, to the point where said sewer intersects the main line of the sewer heretofore described, at a point 20 feet east of the east line of Court street, connecting with the branch of said sewer system running up Union street heretofore described, from the east and west, by convenient curves of about a twenty-foot radius.
Also a branch line of said sewer system, commencing at a point in the center of said alley between second and third streets, 105 feet east of the east line of Court street, and running easterly along the center of said alley to the west line of Laughlin street; thence continuing in a straight line on the same course across Laughlin street, to a point on the east line of said street, 125 feet north of second street; thence continuing on said straight line, in the same course, 10 feet east of Jefferson street, to a point 10 feet east of the west line of Jefferson street and 125 feet north of second street; thence at a left deflection from the line last described, 35 degrees and 25 minutes from the east line of Jefferson street; thence at a right deflection from the line last described 23 degrees and 15 minutes, 116-17 feet, thence at a right deflection from the line last described 27 degrees and 20 minutes 110-100 feet to a stake 17-82 100 feet from the southeast corner of the lawn fence west of the R. & N. Co. yard; thence at a right deflection from said line 11 degrees and 41 minutes, 45-9-10 feet to a point on the west line of Monroe street 131 feet north of second street; thence at a right deflection from the north east corner of Monroe street 70 feet east of Monroe street; thence at a right deflection from the last line 7-2, 206-26-100 feet, to a stake 100 feet east of the west line of second street and 46-75-100 feet west of the west end of the Wasco warehouse.
A branch of said sewer system shall connect with the main line in Union street, 24 feet from the east line of said street, at a point 125 feet north of second street, and shall run along said Union street 20 feet east of the west line thereof, to a point 20 feet south of the north line of second street.
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Also a branch of said sewer system commencing in the center of the alley between second and third streets, on the east line of Washington street, and running easterly along the center of said alley, to a point where the center of said alley intersects with the present sewer of Max Vegt & Co., where it crosses said alley, thence northerly and easterly along the line of said sewer as it is now located, to the point where said sewer intersects the main line of the sewer heretofore described, at a point 20 feet east of the east line of Court street, connecting with the branch of said sewer system running up Union street heretofore described, from the east and west, by convenient curves of about a twenty-foot radius.
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
