GOOD PRICES FOR WHEAT.

If the rains do not interfere harvest in the Inland Empire this year will yield within twenty per cent of the total of last year. The Spokesman-Review says: If conditions do not change, spring sown wheat may be depended upon to even increase the estimated yield. The farmer naturally begins to figure upon the sale of his wheat as soon as he is assured that the growth on his fields will be transferred to the warehouse. 




