THE BOERS.

It is probable that Great Britain will have to fight the Boers. That is about the only solution that will come out of the present difficulties. Great Britain has always asserted its suzerainty over the Transvaal republic, and even after the war of 1880-81, which resulted so disastrously to the British arms, peace was concluded on the basis of a British protectorate, but granting the Boers local self-government.

While the United States is not so largely interested as Great Britain, we have still quite a number of former citizens there, some of whom have been maltreated and whose legitimate enterprise has been hampered by the narrow, selfish and tyrannical policy of the Boer government; hence we should sympathize with the British demands for fair franchise regulations. The United States has always provided liberal naturalization laws, and this is the correct policy for any new and undeveloyed country. The Boers, however, seem disposed to flock by themselves and to monopolize a vast region of the earth, especially rich in mineral wealth, to their own nonprogressive methods. Had it not THE DALLES. - - OR. been for the "uitlanders," as they call the foreign residents, the gold and diamond mines of Boerland would never have been developed. The country would have remained in a condition about as primitive as that of the regions of Asia occupied by the berdsmen tribes before the dawn of civilization. In this country the Mormons, under the leadership The Dalles, Portland and Astoria of Brigham Young, tried to pursue about the same policy and prevent the development of the mineral riches of Utah. Many miners were murdered and Genttle emigrants were massacred by bands of Mormons disguised as Indians. But in the end the Mormons had to yield to the forces of civilization, as the Boers will,

The Boers killed and drove out cr subdued the native Africans because they wanted their country, and when they had obtained it they settled down in a mode of life only a little more progressive and civilized than that of the aborigines. The excuse for taking the land of the aborigines in America and in Africa is that they would not improve it, and that the growing population of the world will not admit of vast tracts being Touching at way points on both sides of the sparsely occupied and held back from civilizing influences by a few nomadic savages. Enterprising outsiders or "uitlanders" have pushed in, attracted by the marvelous mineral riches and field for various enterprises, and demand an opportunity to work and thrive. They have as much right there as the Boers had originally. All they ask now is the right of naturalization, equal taxation and equal privileges of citizenship after they have complied with reasonable residential requirements.
