Operations of Metal Trust.

New York, Aug. 24 .- The Times says: The Union Steel & Chain Company, which was organized three months ago under the laws of Delaware, is reaching out in every direction to control, so far as possible, the blast furnaces, bessemer converters, ore mills, coking and steam coal mines, roller mills and chain and iron works of the country. The company has a capital of \$60,000,000, and William Rockefeller is one of the moving spirits in the combination.

A partial list of the plants under option to the company may be summarized as follows: Bessemer converters and open-hearth steel furnaces, six; ore mines, four; coking and steam coal mines, four; blast furnaces, 15; rolling mills, 30; chain and iron works, 19.

SENATOR PEN-ROSE SPEECH

Administration Endorsed - Senator Quay Was Given an Ovation When He Entered Hall With Chairman Elkin.

HARRISDURG, Pa., Aug. 24.-The Republican etate convention today nominated Colonel James Barnet, of the Tenth regiment, for state treasurer; J. Hay Brown, of Lanchester, for supreme judge, and Josiah R. Adams, of Philadelphia, for superior court judge. The nomination for supreme judge is equivalent to election by reason of two vacancles, and no elector being entitled to vote for more than one person. The platform indorses the administrations of McKinley and Governor Stone, commends the executive for his appointment of Quay to the United States senate and pledges the party to reduction in expenditures of the departments of state government.

A demonstration was given Senator Quay when he entered the hall accompanied by State Chairman Elkin. The convention was called to order by Chairman Elkin and Senator Penrose was elected temporary chairman.

After reviewing events of the past three years in an extended speech, and referring to the coming convention he said : "The supreme importance of sending to that convention delegates who will give eral Miles and Adjutant-General Corbin an active and stalwart support to the renomination of Hon. William McKinley,"

"He ranks with the great presidents of state. He has the unbounded confidence of the people of the country, irrespective of party, believing as they do in his in-It has been most fortunate for our country that he has been at the head of the government in the trying times for the past two years. Few will realize the enormous burdens which have been imposed on him, taxing almost to the limit his mental and physical energies. 
