

It is not known whether the Puerto Ricans and Filipinos are to be taken into account in determing the new center; if they are, it will be found to be considerably to the southwest of the point named in 1890. But the westward movement in 1900 is not likely to be as really pronounced as that shown by the center of population in 1910. For the next ten years the large growth of the United States is to be on the Pacific coast and at the end of that time it is likely that the center of population will be found to be in that section which only a few years ago was described as "wild and woolly."-Spokesman-Review.






