STRANGE THINGS.

Colonel Dick, the chairman of the Republican state committee of Ohio, is evidently hoping for a great deal from Governor Roosevelt's coming visit to Ohio to participate in the Republican state campaign. He has interviewed himself to say he expects Roosevelt to be the Republican candidate for president in 1904, adding that an unnamed friend of his who has traveled in the West has told him that Roosevelt is the most popular man in the country excepting the president. After such a nice indorsement for a presidential term that is still five years in the distance, what can Governor Roosevelt do but tell the Ohio Republicans that he is for McKinley, and that they ought to carry the state this fall as a send-off to his re-nomination and re-election next year. It is very evident that Colonel Dick is offering future presidential honors to Roosevelt in exchange for present help to carry Ohio in McKinley's interest .- Philadelphia Times.




