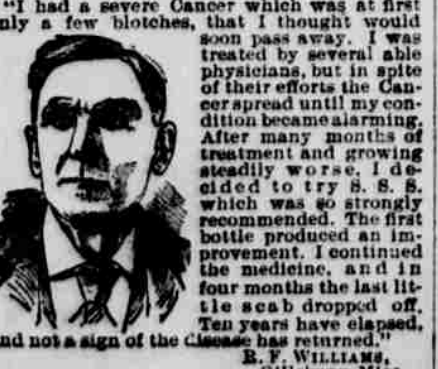
PEOPLE YOU ALL KNOW.

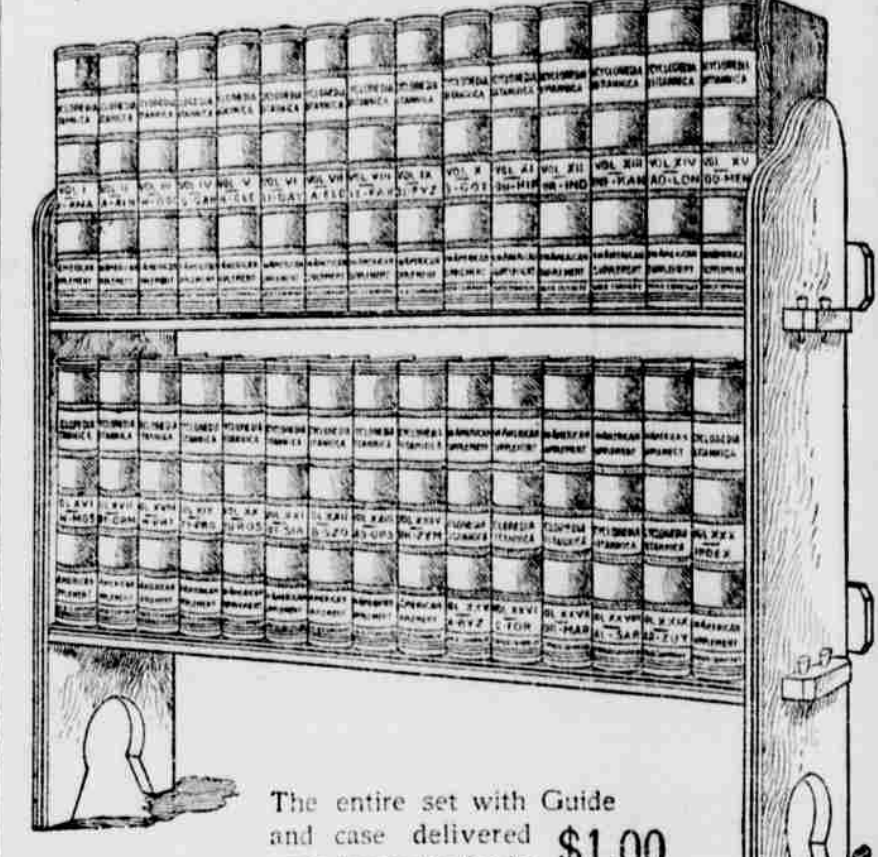
