UNHAPPY FRANCE.

Dr. Emil G. Hirsch, a Jewish rabbi of Chicago, has recently returned from a three months' vacation abroad. He spent some time in Paris and was an interested observer of events as they were influenced by the Dreyfus trial. In speaking of conditions as he found them there he said:

"France is frenzied. Her people seem to have gone mad. A revolution must end all. No matter how the Dreyfus case results I connot see any peace ahead for France. There will be bloodshed, war of party More Flies archists and socialists against their Are Caught enemies, mobbing of Jews, and what will come of it all only the most lurid painter of the destiny of an unhappy nation can depict."

Dr. Hirsch, although there are only 80,000 Jews in the entire country, says there is an intense hatred against them. The Jews are accused of having all the money, of not being French, of having neither God nor country. He found no tenable foundation for the prejudice against the Jews. The frenzy of the people, their intense and foolish impatience, and the chimerical stamina of their government leads Dr. Hirsch to believe that the French people have in reality deteriorated seriously, physic catches more than either. No insect cally and mentally.

Of course the administration is not alarmed at those reports from Europe about alleged combinations among Southern American nations against the United States. The South Amer- M. ican countries know that the expan sion of the United States in the Gulf of Mexico and in the Pacific is no menace to any of the Latin-American nations. This country is not seeking any territory in Central or South America. The United States is the protector and not the enemy of the countries to the south of it. The relations of this country to all of them are as cordial as at any time in the past. The German and French newspapers which are talking about South Americian alliances against the United States are either influenced by their prejudices or they are ignorant of the conditions on this continent.

While on the Pacific coast, where everybody is for expansion, Bryan takes occassion to say that he does not favor the withdrawal of troops from the Philippines until a stable government is established. A few days ago he was in the Eighth Missouri district denouncing this policy as imperialism and militarism, and advising voters to "unreservedly condemn" the president for carrying it into effect. Bryan adjusts his principles to one thing in Nebraska, to another in Missouri, and to still an-

other in Cailfornia. A few weeks hence be will be preaching the gospel of Goebelism in Kentucky.

A rabid anti-expansion paper in Massachusetts describes Jefferson's Louisiana purchase as"the annexation of contiguous territory, with the full consent of the few inhabitants occupying it." Jefferson never asked the consent and never heard of it. History gives no trace of the consent. The Massachusetts éditor is surprisingly weak in handling facts.




