FALSE INTERVIEWS.

A shameless system of lying, cultivated of late by certain newspapers, demands general attention. Public men wherever they go are compelled to run the gantlet of absolute falsehoods purporting to be interviews. When Dewey touched at Trieste a bogus interview represented that he was discussing a future war with Germany. Similar fiction was fixed up when he stopped for a few days at Italian and French ports, and the moment he left Gibraltar for home a talk was invented in which he is made to express broad generalizations about the capacities of the Filipinos. None of these pretended interviews were written by persons who had seen or talked with Dewey. The stuff they cooked up is as easy to write in a back room in New York as in Naples, or Nice or London. It is a product of the reckless mendacity that will write and print anything to produce a desired effect. These creatures, traced back to their base, would probably be found drawing pay from the Tagal secret service fund.
