A MORAL TRIBE.

Among the Carlbs of Central America All Sins Are Punished by Starvation.

In the whole wide world there is not a class of people to be found who infliet severer punishment upon themselves than the Caribs of Central America. Their religion, which is one of the most reculiar kind, demands selfpunishment for sins intentionally or unintentionally committed, says Pearson's Weekly.

The punishment takes the form of starvation and close confinement.

If the sin be in the form of a lie, no matter whether it is calculated to injure another or not, the sinner goes without either food or drink for three days, at the end of which it is believed that the offender has paid the penalty for his or her sin.

Blaspheming and using bad language is punishable by absolute starvation for two days. Assault, drunkenness and other serious sins call for four days' starvation for one week, three days' starvation for the second week, and two days' starvation for the third week, and one day's starvation in the fourth

All sins are punished with starvation. For that reason crime is very low among the Caribs, who are among the best behaved and most truthful people in the world.

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
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
