NO FURTHER PARLEYING.

The work of parleying with Aguinaldo has ended, says the Globe-Democrat. The head of the Philippine commission is in the United States, and the rest of the members of that body have been ordered to return to this country. This course of the administration is somewhat different from what the commission expected. Preparations had been made by its members for a stay in the islands of several months longer Dalles, Oregon. at least, but this order cuts that program short. All the commissioners on the islands will be on the road home in a few days, and the business of dealing with the rebels will be left to the army alone.

This disposition of things will give entire satisfaction to the people of the United States. The commission learned something of the conditions in the islands. It had interviews with Aguinalde's chief emissaries, talked with representative Filipinos who are not connected with the rebellion, went around among the principal foreign residents of the Luzon, and doubtless made a study of the economic and social conditions in the islands, at least in a rudimentary way. The information which saying, but it has gamed will probably be of some service to the administration and to congress. But the commission did nothing toward hastening the end of the war, rations for destruction of insect life, It probably, on the other hand, lengthened the war, for the Filipinos, like all Orientals, are apt to look at concessions, explanations and intercessions as a sign of weakness and fear on the part of the persons or people making them. When the commission was sent out to the islands Aguinaldo doubtless felt that the Americans were ready to surrender and leave the archipelago. This delusion was probably strengthened by the patience with which the commission paltered with Aguinaldo's representatives, and by the ease with which it was deluded by their precommission was sent out to the which it was deluded by their pretentions and promises.

During the time in which all this palvering was going on the movements of Otia' army were necessarily suspended, and Aguinaldo bad time to rally his scattered and dispirited followers. Thus the commission did. unintentionally and unconsciously, a good deal of harm to the American cause. The administration, of course, is not to blame for this fiasco of the commissioners. The situation was new, and Americans never had any extensive dealings with Orientals under those conditions along to that time. The experience will not be lost on the government. Meanwhile the ostensible peacemakers will be






