The frequency with which princes and presidents in these days become the guests of other potentates or peoples marks one of the advances which have been in the amenities of civilization in the modern age, says the Globe-Democrat. There was surprise for a time in the gay world of Europe when Charles V. of Germany visited Henry VIII. of England, and when Henry immediately afterward called on Francis I., the French king. So many exchanges of courtesies between monarchs in the same length of time were so unusual in that day that they were incomprehensible to the subjects of these sovereigns. William II. of Germany, in his reign of eleven years, has made more visits to other countries than his own than any previous bead of the German Empire or of the Prussian Kingdom in the present century. He has been in every great nation of Europe since 1888 except France and in some of the smaller countries. He is credited with a strong desire to go to Paris in 1900 to visit the exposition, and the recent rapprochement between the two countries, temporarily interrupted during the Dreyfus trial, reveals a posibility that he will do

Nicholas II. has also done a good deal of traveling in other countries during the few years in which he has been on the throne. These visits are something more than the calls which the mere demands of politeness dictate.
