**TOO MANY IRONS IN THE FIRE**

Admiral Dewey has been interviewed in New York, and, according to the Evening Post of that city, has made some observations that are full of the usual Dewey sense. Among other things he says that the Philippine difficulty should have been ended by this time, and he intimates that one reason why it hasn't been is because General Otis has tried to do too much, having been anxious to be general, governor, judge and everything else. He has insisted on holding all the reins, something which one man cannot do. As the admiral expressed it, "it is enough for a man to do one thing, to be one thing, but when a man tries to do everything and be everything, it is easy to imagine the result."

This idea has been entertained by many people for a long time. However capable General Otis may be, it is certain that he has allowed himself to become engrossed with petty details and missed the larger results. It would have been well had he devoted his whole attention to military operations and postponed a few of the civil reforms. First of all, the insurrection must be put down. The military campaign is the matter of paramount importance, and other things can wait until that campaign has been aggressively pushed and brought to a close. General Otis can never do this successfully until he drops half of the irons he has in the fire and attends to fighting exclusively. Dewey has not made many mistakes; he made none when he told Otis all this.

**THERE IS A SCARCITY.**

"Standard orders are kept on file at the various employment agencies for men to do section work on the three lines of railroads that go through this city, but the agencies complain that there are only a few applications made for that kind of work, although the wages offered are

good. Many men are wanted on what is termed extra gangs, where work will last until winter sets in; and more men are wanted on the regular gangs, where the employment is permanent. In several places in Montana and North Dakota on both roads a number of section foremen are at work with only one and two men each. The employees were lured away by better offers during the harvest period."

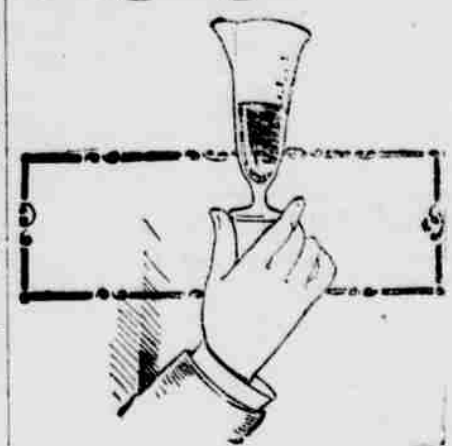
