Experıments in wireless telegraphy made during the international yacht races appear to justity some general
conclusions with regara to the usetulness of this mode of electric communication. Marconi, who may be
considered the inventor of the practical system thus far developed, has himself directed the transmission of dispatches between a steamer accom-
panying the yachts at sea and a station at one of the lighthouses on shore, whence they were again transmitted to New York. It is conceded, of course, that this netial telegraphy cannot, for various reasons, supplant that by wires and cables; but the fact that intelligent messages can be thus transmitted at all, with reasonable directness
Many circumstances may be imag. ined under which this system would not exist, as between ships at sen between a ship off-shore and the land, or where communication by wire or cable has been interrupted. The in its present developuent is in the lack of privacy. A message sent from one station might be picked up But it is quite conceivable that this may be overcome by future inven-
tion, the experiments already made having already indicated to inventors the direction in which they are to work.
The military uses of wireless teleg. raphy are somewhat problematical
In the navy, as among the scattered vessels of a squadron on a cruise, its adapta bility appears less doubtful. Thus far the invention has not passed Ine stage of curious experiments that are or can be connected by metallic conductor, nothing is likely Yet so much has the new system, in so short a lume that it would be foolish to set a limit upon its possible development.
