They ought to declare for British rule in South Africa. It is distressing, of course, that brave Boers should fall before English rifles, but it is just as distressing that brave Britons should fall before Boer marksmen. It should be remem bered, too, that the Boers declared this war and fired the first volleys.

Roberts, the Democratic-polygamist congressman elect from Utah, says he will make a fight to take his seat. Undoubtedly he will. He knew at the time he was nominated that if elected there would be a movement to keep him out of the bouse. He was told of this during the canvass in which he was elected. 




