

inventor of the Linotype Dead.

BALTIMORE, Oct. 28.-Ottmar Mergenthaier, inventor of the linotype typesetting machine, died this morning of consumption.

Mergenthaler was born in Wurtemburg, Germany, in 1854. While he was still a boy he was apprenticed to a watchmaker, but did not serve out his time, owing to his desire to escape military service in the German army. When he landed in Baltimore his entire capital was only \$30. Going to Washington, the young immigrant secured work in the machine shop of his uncle, and it was there that he originated and perfected the machine that has revolutionized the printing business. The invention was somewhat slow in being generally adopted, but Mergenthaler lived to see the product of his genius in universal use. A syndicate, headed by Whitelaw Reid, exploited the patents. Mergenthaler was never strong in health.




