A FINANCIAL FEAT.

Though an American army of 60,000 men will be operating on the other side of the Pacific by the end of the year the revenue of the United States is greater than the expenses, says the Globe-Democrat. Probably no other country ever achieved such a result while prosecuting a war on the same scale. The treasury is ahead on the fiscal year which began July 1st, and also ahead on the ten months of 1899 that have elapsed. Last October the deficit of the month was \$14,352,226. This year there is a surplus for October of \$3,000,000. The first surplus since war preparations began appeared last March and was followed by a surplus of over \$20,000,000 in May and June. The first month of the present fiscal year, July, showed a deficit of \$8,506,832, but August, September and October wipe that out with a margin of over \$3,000,000. Since January 1st last there have been five months with a surplus and four with a deficit. October calls for a heavy pension payment, but the welcome monthly surplus is reported as has been usual of late. Unless something unforeseen happens there will be a handsome surplus at the end of the fiscal year.

Before the war the annual expenses of the government were about \$375,000,000, exclusive of the post office department which comes within a few millions of paying its way. Revenue now is coming in at the rate of \$525,000,000 a year, including about \$120,000,000 from the war taxes, which, like the Dingley tariff, have yielded more than the estimate. These results are due to a high degree of prosperity, and the prosperity is due to the intelligent work of the Republican administration and the confidence it inspires. The new congress, Republican in both branches, will begin its labors without the least misgiving as to revenue. It is refreshing to find Democratic papers urging a reduction in taxes. When they had a Democratic administration on their hands deficits piled up steadily, and bonds were sold largely to meet current expenses in time of peace. Now, in time of war, there is more than enough revenue, but a different party is on deck.

The Oregonian sensibly remarks: The eagerness with which reports of a prize-fight are awaited by great crowds, and the enormous increase of orders for newspapers in which the reports are expected, are facts which go to prove that there are vast multitudes who take little or no interest in the great affairs of the world, and seek newspapers only when reports are expected of events of vile or vicious character, which ought in fact never to be reported at all. What cares the great mass of

those who run eagerly after the news of a prize-fight what events of the sort that make history, decide the course or destiny of nations, change all the affairs of the world, may be transpiring from day to day in the four quarters of the globe? They do not want a newspaper for these things, nor for opinion or discussion of matters that relate to morals, religion, education, politics, industry, business or social life; but let it be announced that a prize-fight is to come off, and they are wild to get "the news." Men and women who never buy a paper, or even look at a paper at other times, then are crazy for it. Multitudes who would take but languid interest, or wouldn't care at all if it were announced that the whole American army in the Philippines had been destroyed, will sit up half the night to get the news of a prize-fight, and the remaining half to talk about it. Well; we have to deal with man as he is, not on any ideal theory. It will be a long time yet till consideration will come like an angel, to whip the offending Adam out of him.

Double Train Service to San Francisco.
On October 15th the Southern Pacific Co. will inaugurate a "Daylight Express," leaving Portland at 8:30 a. m., and reaching San Francisco at 7:45 next evening—only one night out. Both standard Pullman and tourist sleepers will be attached. This new train is in addition to the present 7 p. m. Shasta Overland, and will give many passengers the desired opportunity to see enroute the Great Willamette, Umpqua and Sacramento Valleys without loss of time, and still arrive in Oakland and San Francisco at a reasonable hour.

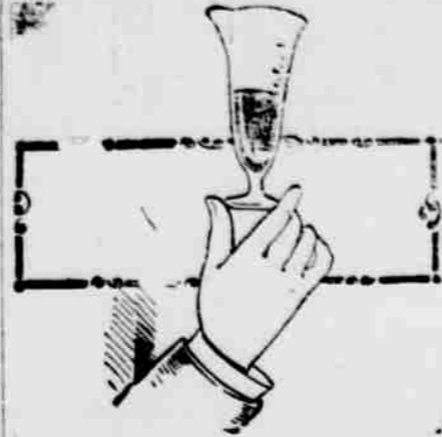
