Opposed to Woman's Suffrage.

A society called the Oregon State Asnent ladies of the city. A circular sent Butler Drug Co. out to the voters of Oregon, eavs in part:

"We desire to call your attention to the fact that an amendment to the constitution of Oregon, giving full suffrage to every adult woman in the state, is to be submitted to your vote in June, 1900.

"We, being Oregon women, and therefore effected by the provisions of such an amendment, wish to enter our protest against its adoption by you.

"We believe only a small percentage of the women of our state ask for or de- giste. eire the ballet. Our school elections prove, as do those of every state in the Union which permits women to vote at such elections, that the great majority Haworth, the printer, over Dalles Comof Oregon women do not use the ballot mission Co. even in school matters, in which they may be presumed to take equal interest J. s. "We believe the majority should rule in this, as in other political matiers, and that a small, though eager minority of our sex should not force the ballot (and its attendant privileges of sitting on juries and running for office) upon the far larger number of women who do not lesire to vote. We have no quarrel with our suffragist sisters; but we protest against their being regarded as representatives of the true opinion of Oregon

women upon this vital subject. "We also believe that the adoption of this suffrage amendment would necessarily lead to serious complications in both the political and social conditions of the state, and that such complications would be harmful to the state in every


