They Have Also Acquired Morgan Holdings in Big Four and Chesapeake & Ohio.

NEW YORK, Nov. 29 .- Extraordinary accomplishments have been completed in Eastern Trunk Line railway affairs, according to the Times. Changes are brought about to three important railroad systems. The Pennsylvania company acquires control of the B. & O. W. K. Vanderbilt, in the interest of the New York Central, takes over controlling holdings of J. P. Morgan in the Cieveiand, Cincinnati, Chicago & St. Louis, and the Chesapeake & Ohio. The two deals have been accomplished together. The executive heads of the Pennsylvania and New York Central have worked together.

It is improbable that either the one great system acquired by the Pennsylvanis or the two important properties acquired by New York Central interests will be forthwith attached in open corporation mergers.


