STATE OF OREGON, EXECUTIVE BEPARTMENT, SALEN, NOV 21, 1899.

In necordance with the provisions of an Act entitled "An Act Submitting to the Electors of the State of Oregon at the ceneral Election to be held on the first Monday in June, 1900, the pending Proposed Constitutional Amendments, appeared February 18, 1800, I. T. T. Geet, Governor of the State of Oregon, do hereby cause the following proposed amendments to the Constitution of the State of Oregon, as certified to by the Secretary of State, to be published for five consecutive weeks in THE PLALES CHRONICE, a newspaper published in the Secretar Judicial District of the State of Oregon.

[SEAL] Done at the Capitol, at Salem, Oregon this 21st day of November, A. D. 1809 T. T. GEER, Governor.

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION, NO. 4. Be it resolved by the Senate, the House con-curring. That the following amendment to the Constitution of the State of Oregon be and is hereby proposed.

That Section 10 of Article XI. of the Constitu-tion of the State of Oregon be and the same is hereby abrogated, and in hou thereof. S. ction 10 of Article XI. shall be as follows.

section 10. No county, city, town, school district or other municipal cornoration shall be allowed to become indebted in any manner or for any purpose to an amount including present existing indebtedness in the aggregate exceeding live per centum on the value of the taxable property therein to be ascertained by the last assessment for State and county taxes previous to astrocut for State and county taxes previous to be incurring of such indebtedness.

That the following amendment to the constitution of the State of Oregon, in hea of Section Ten of Article Seren Ch, be and the same is hereby proposed, to-wit:

SECTION TEN.

The legislative Assembly may provide for the election of Supreme and Circuit Judges in distinct classes, one of which classes shall consist of five Justices of the Supreme Court, who shall not perform circuit duty; and the other class shall consist of as many Circuit Judges as may be deemed necess ry, who shall hold full terms without allotment and who shall take the same outh as the Supreme Judges.

The Legislative Assemble may create as many circuits as may be necessary.


