Be it reserved by the senate, the House concurring: That the following amendment to the Constitution of the State of Oregon be and is bereby proposed:

That section 10 of Article XI, of the Constitution of the State of Oregon be and the same is bereby abrogated, and in flee thereof. Section 10 of Article XI, shall be as follows:

ARTICLE XI. Section 10. No county, city, town, school district or other municipal corporation shall be allowed to become indebted in any manner or for any purpose to an amount inclining present existing indebtedness in the aggregate exceeding five per centum on the value of the taxable property therein to be accertained by the last assessment for State and county taxes previous to the incurring of such indebtedness.

The Legislative Assembly may provide for the election of supreme and tircul; Judges in distinct classes, one of which classes shall consist of five Justices of the supreme bourt, who shall not perform circuit duty; and the other class-shall consist of as many circuit Judges as may be deemed necessity, who shall hold full terms without allotment and who shall hold full terms without allotment and who shall take the same outh as the supreme ludges.

The Legislative Assembly may create as many circuits as may be necessary.


