Under the provisions of the registration law all persons when registering are required to furnish to be registering officer the following information:

If naturalized, the time, place, and court of naturalization. In this connection, it is necessary to produce naturalization papers, or declaration of intention.

Residence must be specific; giving precinct, section, township and range; Some queer conversations take place if within town or city, the street, No. if

In order to avoid unnecessary delay and inconvenience, every person desiring to register should be prepared to furnish the above information.

Facilities will be furnished in eyery precinct in the county by either Justice of the Peace or Notary Public.
