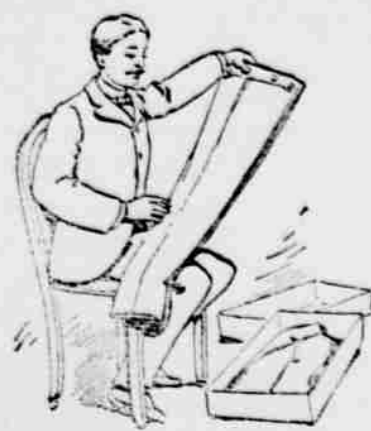

A COMMON CASE.

Every time one Smith gets drunk, which is frequently, he goes home and beats his wife and children, and sometimes turns them out of doors. If one of them dares complain, or if some one else complains, Smith is arrested, and sobers up in the city jail. But his beaten wife or child "weakens" next day, and refuses to testify against him, and he goes free to do the same trick over again. Or, if his wife and children have the courage to tell the truth about the brute, and he is "sent up" for a month, or two or six months, what benefit is that to them? Perhaps when he was free he did support or partially support them, in a fashion, besides getting drunk and beating them once in a week or two. But now they are deprived of support entirely. And when he gets out he is more liable to get drunk and abuse them than before. Imprisonment hasn't much terror for him, but is just sufficient punishment to make him feel revengeful toward his helpless family. Thus the county is put to expense, Smith is only made worse, and his family suffers all the more, by the present method of dealing with such cases.

Yesterday Smith's name was Ed Hughes, today it will be something else, but every few days such a case turns up in the police court, with about this result.

If legislators and officials who execute the law cannot devise means by which men of this temperament and character can be made to work like the slaves they ought to be for punishment, the proceeds to go to the support of the family, then the legislature can and should provide the only other proper punishment for this offense, namely, a severe public whipping. If the lash was a well laid on in the presence of a crowd, the dastardly coward who brutally beats his wife when drunk would soon become a very rare offender. For this one offense, at least, the public whipping post would not be an evidence of barbarism, but of good, common sense.—Telegram.

The Texas Populists have taken a step which will frighten Bryan, says the Statesman. Their state committee, in its meeting at Dallas, formulated a demand that the national convention of the Populist party be held at least a month earlier than the Republican and Democratic conventions. The purpose of this is, of course, to head off any attempt to fuse with the Democrats in 1900. A large majority of the Populists of Texas are against fusion. This seems to be the case in several of the Southern states. Fusion is far less

agreeable to the Populists than it was in 1896. The indications grow stronger every day that the base money aggregation of three years ago has collapsed. Bryan, or whoever gets the nomination of the Democracy in 1900, will probably have only one party behind him this time.

It may be expected that a number of bills will be presented to congress relating to the temporary government of the Philippines. Senator Spooner has introduced a bill in the senate which, briefly stated, provides that when the insurrection shall have been suppressed the government of the islands shall be vested in such person or persons as the president may direct until congress shall decide how the islands shall be governed. The bill is but a reproduction of the early policy of the government in dealing with its territorial possessions.—Union.

Mark Hanna says that President McKinley will be renominated by the Republican national convention and will receive the vote of every delegate therein. It is evident that Mr. Hanna does not expect Mr. Scott, of the Oregonian, to be a member of that convention.

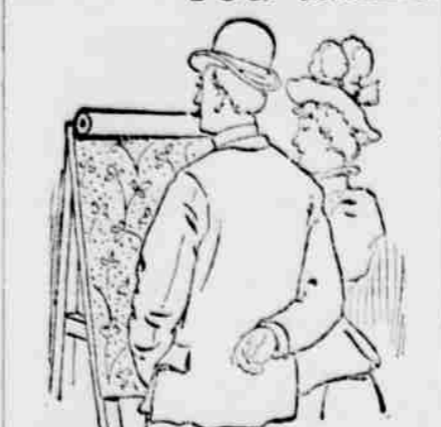
