# BOER PATROL

Lost Fourteen Men Killed and Twenty Wounded-British Loss Was Insignificant-Bombardment at Swars kopf Was Resumed Yesterday.

BOER CAMP, Upper Tugela River, Jan. 23.—The British now occupy three positions along the Tugels river. Their naval guns have been firing steel-pointed, armor-piercing shells.

Reports being received that 2000 British cavalry were attempting to outflank us along the Drakensburg ridge, s strong patrol was sent to reconnoiter. a terrific rifle and Maxim gun fire loss was probably insignificant.
