What Oregon's Students Are Doing at the University.

The most important event of the week was the Glee Club reception given by President and Mrs. Strong and the local alumni, at Villard Hall. The Glee Club then sang and of course were encored. The Treble-clef club gave a well rendered selection, refusing to respond to the encore. The rough house quartet, composed of Meers, Goodrich, as leader, Pat McArthur, singing higher basso and Blythe and Whittiesy, furnishing the discord, sang a "rooter's song" with variations, accentuations, etc. Its discordant harmony was execrable.

At the weekly assembly the student body listened to a well prepared address by Mr. H. H. Hopkins, '93, on the necessity of a thorough education. Rev. G. F. Hall, of Illinois, also made a few appropriate remarks.

The Philologist society had an installation of officers Friday evening. Its new officers are: President, W. L. Whittiesy; vice president, M. L. Applegate; secretary, Arthur L. Gampier; librarian, W. G. V. Hughes; censor, A. B. Waltz; treasurer, G. O. Russel; sergeant-at-arms, C. E. Gray. After the installation the society listened to Prof. F. L.
