TO THE EDITOR:

Just a few words, with your kind permission, regarding my challenge to Mr. Hugh Gourlay to debate the money question. I had no idea that the matter would grow to the proportion it has. Mr. Gourlay's few remarks before the society were the strongest, most vigorous and logical presentation of the gold standard policy I have ever had the pleasure to listen to. I only challenged him to a joint discussion because of an abiding faith in the justice of my cause and for the further reason that there seems to be too studied an anxiety on the part of its opponents to consider the cause of silver "dead and petrified."

If Mr. Gourlay will discuss the question that the gold standard is (or will be) a benefit to the people of the United States, I will gladly meet him at such time as may be mutually agreeable. In which event I will do my utmost to give him the historical fact he desires, together with other historical facts that are absolutely necessary to a fair consideration of the question. If Mr. Gourlay will not debate, is there not in the whole ranks of the triumphant gold standard organization of Wasco county some one who will give a reason for the faith that is within him? In this latter event, I would retire from what may appear as a self-constituted champion of the bimetalists of Wasco county—to a large number of whom I am a perfect stranger—but will say, in their behalf that from their own ranks they will meet any and all comers, and that the matter would be placed in the hands of a proper committee.

As to the remarks of Mr. Gourlay concerning me personally, I desire to say I

regard them as extremely unkind and unworthy of the genial, whole-souled gentleman he is, and as I have always found him. For the nonce I overlook them.

## Proposals for Refunding Water Bonds, Dalles City Oregon.

Sealed proposals will be received by the board of water commissioners of Dalles City, Oregon, at said city until 8:30 o'clock p. m. of the 26 day of Feb., 1900, for twenty-five thousand dollars; and twenty thousand dollars of refunding water bonds of said city, (as it is not settled as to whether the total amount of bonds will be \$25,000 or \$20,000) authority is extended to the said board to issue refunding water bonds in the sum of \$25,000, but if found not to be necessary, the issue will be for no more than \$20,000; and at a rate of interest not exceeding four per cent per annum payable twenty years from date of issue, interest payable semi-annually, principal and interest payable in gold coin of the United States, at any city therein, at the option of the buyer.

The bonds mentioned will be issued under the provisions of the several legislative acts of the state of Oregon, approved Feb. 26, 1885, Feb. 19, 1889, and Feb. 14, 1895, and in pursuance of an ordinance adopted by the common council of Dalles City, approved January 25, 1900. The proposed refunding water bonds are intended for the redemption of outstanding water bonds in the sum of \$25,000; but in case the board of water commissioners prefer, it will issue refunding bonds for \$20,000 only, therefore bidders may make proposals for both \$25,000 and \$20,000, and in the denomination of \$500 each.

No bid will be entertained for a rate less than par value of the bonds. Premiums and rate of interest will be taken into consideration in passing on the value of all bids.

Bidders must deposit with the president of the board a duly certified check on some responsible bank equal to 2 per cent of the amount of bonds bid for, or accompany his bid with cash of such amount as will equal such per cent of his bid, and such certified check made payable to the president of the board of water commissioners of Dalles City, Or., as liquidated damages in case the bidder shall fail or neglect to receive and pay for, at the office of the city treasurer of said city, the bonds awarded to him on his bid, on or before the first day of March, 1900.

Attention should be given the fact that the board will not issue and dispose of more than \$20,000 of such refunding bonds, unless it shall be deemed necessary to do so, but otherwise, if the board shall find that it is necessary to issue bonds in the sum of \$25,000, it will then offer and issue the full sum, (\$25,000). The right to reject any and all bids is reserved by the said board of water commissioners.

Bids should be addressed to the president of said board, or to the city recorder, Dalles City, Wasco county, Oregon, and noted "Proposals for refunding water bonds."
