TEACH SPANISH.

A wide business and educational field is presented in the Philippines, where the services of hundreds of American teachers and clerks will be required. Lucrative positions will await the ambitious young man or woman of Washington once the new possessions are relieved of the incubus of rebellion, says the Spokesman-Review. But the universities, normal schools and high schools of the West and East have failed to grasp the situation. To teach successfully in the islands of the Philippines a knowledge of Spanish is required. To transact business knowledge of Spanish is imperative. In Puerto Rico and Cuba it is even more necessary than in the Philippines. Inasmuch as students in high schools and normal schools seek a practical education and hope to fit themselves for earning their livelihood, why not make the study of Spanish a part of the course?

Spanish is easily mastered. The language is far less difficult of pronunciation than French and German, and will be of far more practical benefit to those who enter commercial and educational life. Especially on the seacoast it will be of inestimable advantage to business men. Government positions go begging for want of bright young men and women who have failed to master the tongue of the new colonial citizens. Two years' study in any school, if the system is thorough, should be ample for the average student to learn to read, write and speak the Spanish language. With the narrowing of business openings in the United States to the poor young man or woman the opening afforded by the colonies will prove an inestimable boon. It is strange that the directors of educational institutions have not already included the study of Spanish in their curriculum.

The disappointments of the Klondike are to be repeated this year on the bleak sands of Cape Nome. Alaska is a far land, strike news is a long time in reaching the centers of population, and there are always men enough and to spare to pick up the rich claims before the arrival of the man who comes in with the rush. Cape Nome being in American territory, the placer grounds are subject to the American mining laws. These permit one man to stake a creek from one end to the other, and hold it with little or no work for nearly two years. Consequently every foot of creek ground which might prove rich or profitable was staked last summer. As for the beach diggings, they, too, are uncertain. It is a question whether the government

will permit their working, and the extent of the beach deposits is also problematical. Experienced Alaska miners who came out last fall contend that the pay ground along the beach at Nome is already practically worked out.

Notice to Voters.

Under the provisions of the registration law all persons when registering are required to furnish to the registering officer the following information:

If naturalized, the time, place, and court of naturalization. In this connection, it is necessary to produce naturalization papers, or declaration of intention.

Residence must be specific; giving precinct, section, township and range; if within town or city, the street, No. if any, and No. of lot and block; if in any building where rooms are numbered, the number of the room and floor must be given.

In order to avoid unnecessary delay and inconvenience, every person desiring to register should be prepared to furnish the above information.

Facilities will be furnished in every precinct in the county by either Justice of the Peace or Notary Public.

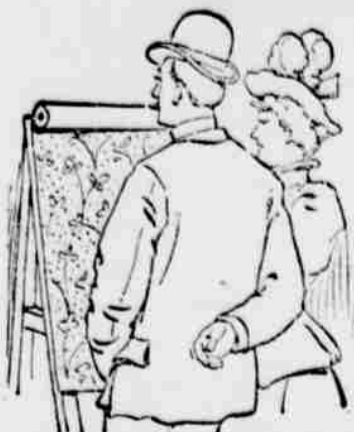
