Smallpox is Raging in Mississippi.

JACKSON, Miss., March 8 .- An official report made to the Hinds County Board of affairs in the Jonesville neighborhood, The community is literally honeycombed some big men. with smallpox of the most virulent form, and during the past six weeks nearly 100 deaths have occurred. On some days the death rate has been so large that it was impossible to secure coffine, and rude caskets were made from rails. Whole families were wiped out of existence and of several large families only one or two children are left.
