Call for Republican County Convention.

The Republican County Convention of Wasco County, State of Oregon, is hereby called to meet in Dalles City, in said county, on Friday March 23, 1900, at the hour of 10 o'clock a. m. of said day, for the purpose of nominating candidates for the following county offices: county judge, county clerk, county sheriff, county treasurer, one county commissioner, county assessor, county school superintendent, county coroner, and county surveyor, also precinct officers for the several precincts of said county; and 10 delegates to the Republican State and District Congressional Conventions, and to transact such other business as may properly come before said County Convention. The convention will consist of 100 delegates chosen by the several precincts, and the several precincts of said county will be entitled to representation in said convention as follows:

Primaries to elect delegates to said County Convention will be held in each of the several precincts in said Wasco County, on March 17, 1900. In East Dalles precinct the polls for said primary election will be located at the East End Horse Co's house, and H. Rice, C. E. Chrisman and L. S. Davis will act as judges at said election; in Bigelow precinct the polls will be located at the office of Wm. Mitchell, and J. M. Patterson, F. Faulkner and Wm. Mitchell will act as judges at said election; in Trevitt precinct the polls will be located at the northeast corner of Third and Union streets, and F. I. Sampson, Frank Vogt and J. Fisher will act as judges at said election; and in West Dalles precinct the polls will be located at the City Mills, and G. L. Schmidt, J. F. Staniels and C. M.
