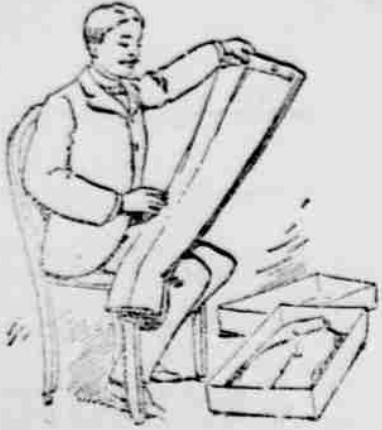

The Republican party has redeemed its pledges for financial reform and the financial bill has been signed by the president and is now a law of the land. The result will justify every claim made by the party in the last national campaign. The result, by anticipation, has done that already. Financial panics will be rare, but should they come their coming will not be caused by the dread of a degraded currency. 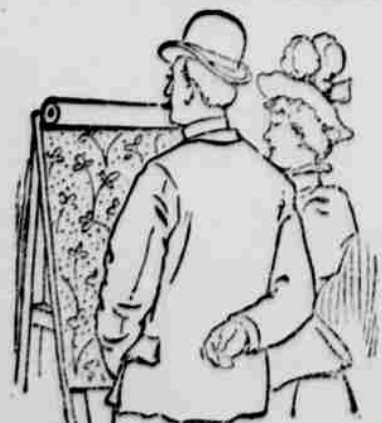
