"The Washington dispatch published in the Oregonian of the 15th does not properly represent my attitude on the Puerto Rican bill," says Representative Tongue. "I voted in the caucus and in the House to reduce the tariff from 25 to 15 per cent, and to limit the operation of the bill to two years. I was one of ter amendment. 




