### Tongue on Puerto Rico.

"The Washington dispatch published in the Oregonian of the 15th does not properly represent my attitude on the Puerto Rican bill," says Representative Tongue. "I voted in the caucus and in the House to reduce the tariff from 25 to 15 per cent, and to limit the operation of the bill to two years. I was one of the most strenuous advocates of the latter amendment. But it is asserted by the opponents of the bill that this small tariff upon the necessary food products in Puerto Rico will be oppressive to the poor people of that island. I have said that if this is true, it might be well for the senate to consider a proposition to admit such articles duty free, and increase the tariff 25 per cent on sugar and tobacco, as the entire crop of these articles, it is said, has been caught by the trusts and speculators.

"The only reason that justifies the House bill or that secured the votes necessary to pass it, including my own, is the necessity of raising revenue to maintain government in Puerto Rico, temporarily, until the people can recover from their present distressed conditions. With normal conditions restored, and other revenue measures enacted, commercial intercourse between Puerto Rico and the United States should and will be as free as between Oregon and California."
