HORTICULTURAL BOARD.

The Benefit of Spraying Fruit Trees Conclusively Demonstrated.

At the meeting of the State Board of Horticulture, which was held in Portland Tuesday, the efficiency of spraying fruit trees for the extermination of the codlin moth was most conclusively demonstrated. Most satisfactory results, it was shown, were produced where the spray was properly prepared, and the spraying persisted in. Oilwell Bros., of New York, who have 160 acres of apple trees, spray them systematically five times during the season, and have secured 98 per cent of clean fruit thereby, only 2 per cent containing worms. They sold \$14,000 worth of apples last year.

H. C. Sayers, of Hood River, reported, as the result of thorough spraying, the securing of 95 per cent of clean fruit, with only 5 per cent showing worms.

E. L. Smith, of Hood River, reported also 95 per cent of clean fruit as the result of systematic spraying.

LaSalle Bros., of Albany, who have fifty acres of apple trees, by persistent spraying saved 96 per cent of their fruit. Many others reported equally satisfactory results from following this plan. All these fruit-raisers have used the particular spray recommended by the board, and, in view of such testimony, the conclusion was unavoidably reached that the contention that spraying is ineffectual is fallacious as well as absurd.
