**A HANDSOME INDORSEMENT.**

The sentiment of Eastern Oregon Republicans towards the Republican candidate for congress for this district is well expressed in the following editorial from the Harney County News:

"For those places which concern the electors of this county and district most closely, we have, for representative in congress, Hon. Malcolm A. Moody, of The Dalles, a business man of ability and unquestionable integrity; one who has grown into manhood among the changing scenes of Eastern Oregon's development, and who for two years has ably represented his district in the federal congress. Mr. Moody has legions of personal and political friends throughout the district, is thoroughly Republican, and his perception of the party's true attitude toward the questions that confront the country is far reaching, clear and correct.
