WASHINGTON, April 30 .- In comparion with the casualties suffered by the British troops in South Africa, those sustained by the American forces in the Philippines seem very small. A statement just compiled by the war department shows that from July 1, 1898, when American troops reached Manila, until April 27, 1900, these deaths have occurred


