NO SUCH STATEMENT WAS MADE

It is a matter of common street talk among democrats in this city, and is being used to elect democrats to office, that some time since a committee of machinists from the Albina car shops called on President Mohler, of the O. R. & N. Company, and asked for an increase of wages. As the story goes they were met with this reply:

"Gentleman, you voted the wrong ticket in '96 to warrant you in asking or expecting an increase of wages at this time. The republican tariff has so increased the price of rails and other railroad material that an increase of wages is at this time impossible."

Believing that this story was an invention, covertly designed to effect railroad men's votes, the editor of THE CHRONICLE addressed the following letter to Mr. Mohler:

THE DALLES, Apr. 23, 1900. A. L. MOHLER, Esq.,

DEAR SIR:—It is a matter of common report among certain politicians in these parts that certain railroad employes from Albina some time since applied to you for an increase of wages, and that your reply was in substance: "Gentlemen, you voted the wrong ticket in '96 to ask for or expect an increase of wages. The republican protective tariff laws have so increased the price of rails and other railroad material that an increase of wages is at this time an impossibility." Would you object to state, over your own signature, so that it may be used as I may deem fit, if any such interview occurred and if such answer was given by you?

Mr. Mohler promptly replied as follows:

PORTLAND, Apr. 24, 1900. H. GOURLAY, EDITOR CHRONICLE.

DEAR SIR:—Your favor of April 23d received. The security owners of this company are composed of the different political parties of the United States, and its employes are composed of the same different parties. Under no circumstances has this company, since my connection with it, (nor will it) ask the employes to vote for any particular political party, nor will it undertake to influence such votes. I have made no such statement as referred to in your favor. This company's relations, so far as I know, are perfectly harmonious with the men in its employ at Albina, and the parties who furnish such information I believe can plainly be shown not to be employes of

this company. I have no knowledge of how the employes voted four years ago, and have never made the inquiry. I am glad you have given me an opportunity to contradict this statement and explain our position. Yours truly, A. L. MOHLER.

The railroad men are being frantically appealed to to come to the help of the democratic candidates for the Oregon legislative assembly and an election card, now before us, of one of the candidates, has on its obverse side part of the so-called democratic railroad plank and below the appeal: "Railroad men—We will stand by you; will you stand by us?" Now suppose that by any conceivable fatuity this particular democrat should be elected from this district by the aid of railroad men's votes, how much could be accomplished on their behalf? For years the democratic members of the Oregon assembly have hardly numbered a corporal's guard. What have any of them been able to do for their constituents? Practically nothing, for the simple reason that they are not in working harmony with the majority. The next assembly is as certain to be overwhelmingly republican as the sun is to rise tomorrow. A democratic member, of either house, opposed as he would be on principle to the majority, would get to aid from the majority for anything. To accomplish anything of any importance in any legislative body the measure must be fathered by some one in harmony with the majority. This may be all wrong, but as long as party politics exist there is no likelihood of a change. If railroad men have wrongs that ought to be righted—and no one doubts the fact for a moment—why should they waste their votes on men that can do nothing for them, and thus place themselves in antagonism to the only party that has the power to afford relief?
