> soft-Nose Shell Pierces Armor Plate. NEW YORK, May 10 .- James W. Johnson, member of the firm of Isaac G. Johnson & Co., of Spuyten Dayville, my wife's life, she having been a martyr explained last night how the soft steel

"I think," said Mr. Johnson, "that the action of the soft steel cap may be illustrated by a simple experiment. If you would try to drive a single nail through a piece of sheet iron, the nail would bend. But it you first drive a nail through a piece of hardwood it will penetrate the sheet iron.

"The soft nose, in other words, prevents the projectile from glancing off. Its whole force is concentrated at the point. In one of the tests made at Indian Head, we fired a projectile at the armor plate at an angle of twenty-one degrees. No sooner had the soft nose touched the plate than the projectile turned at a right angle to the plate and penetrated it. The cap, or soft nose, also acts as a kind of lubricant to the shell."
