Our contemporary has wasted a large amount of ammunition on the apportionment bill. THE CHRONICLE never admired it and hopes for a better arrangement of senatorial and legislative districts at the next session of the legislature. This much is true; the counties grouped together are those possessing, as far as possible, a community of interests and the mere size of the districts works only a hardship on candidates who feel it their duty to cover them during a campaign. No apportionment could be made by a republican legislature that would please a party whose chief business is to carp and find fault; but that there was even a suggestion of corruption connected with the measure is gratuitous and unfounded.

The fusion candidate for congressman for this district made a speech in Portland a few days ago, devoting three-fourths of the time he occupied to the advocacy of free silver. That's enough. Mr. Smith may be a very nice sort of a fellow and all that; the fact that he still walks among the tombs of the dead past, and bugs to his breast the ten-thousand times exploded lunacy of free silver is enough for the voters of the second district if the candidate for congress had all the virtues of a canonized saint.

Without the aid of republican votes the fusionists cannot elect a single man on their ticket. If you believe in free silver, free trade, free soup, free riot, poverty, idleness and low wages, vote the fusion ticket.

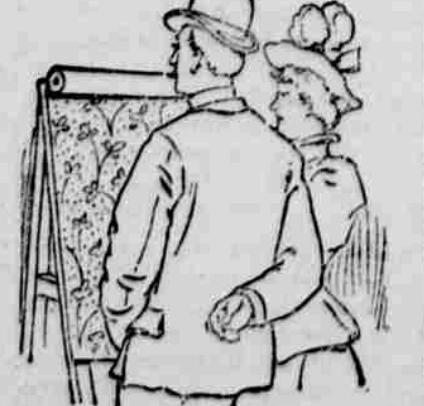
